



Mo also has created three television specials, six animated series, seven musical adaptations, five licensed theater productions, and three touring exhibits. Mo loves playing in new sandboxes. He regularly collaborates with other globally renowned artists and organizations to create bright and innovative new works in the worlds of classical music, opera, comedy concerts, dance, painting, and digital content. Mo's art has been exhibited around the

world including in major solo retrospectives at the High Museum of Art in Atlanta and The New York Historical Museum in NYC. Over the last decade, he has become the most produced playwright of Theatre for Young Audiences in the U.S., having written or co-written four musicals based on his books. 


